#### **12. EAGLETON SUMMER PROGRAM FOR WOMEN**

The National Education for Women's Leadership (NEW Leadership) is currently accepting applications to attend their summer institute at the Eagleton Institute of Politics in NJ. The summer institute is an intensive six-day residential program that is designed to educate, empower and encourage college women to get involved in the political process. Each year, approximately 35 women from colleges and universities from across NJ are selected to attend. Participants gain more than textbook knowledge about politics. During the institute students meet women leaders serving in a variety of political roles, learn from women and politics scholars, participate in skills building workshops, and discuss and refine their own concepts of leadership. After the institute, students develop leadership projects on their campuses or in their communities to put their ideas about leadership into action.

#### **13. EAST COAST STUDENT ENTREPRENEUR AWARDS PROGRAM**

The East Coast Student (Collegiate) Entrepreneur Awards program recognizes undergraduate-level entrepreneurs who run their own businesses in New York, New Jersey, Connecticut and Delaware. Winners are selected based on entrepreneurial spirit, obstacles overcome, success of business, concern for quality and customer service, and estimated potential for future success. Each state identifies first and second place winners and they are awarded \$1,000 and \$500 respectively. In addition, the judges decide on an overall winner, and he/she will receive an extra \$1,000, bringing the total grand prize to \$2,000. The overall winner will automatically be entered into the national competition where the grand prize is \$10,000 and the Innovation and Social Impact award includes \$3000.
