The Graduate Fellows program at Rutgers-Newark is currently accepting applications for part-time 5th grade teachers. This position is open to all and requires NO prior teaching experience but applicants should have a background in science. 3. RESEARCH ASSISTANTSHIP AVAILABLE

A faculty member working in the departments of psychology and social work is seeking motivated fall 06 research assistants to assist with psychological research that involves both lab-based and field-based work centering on the development and prevention of aggression, violence, and related risky behaviors (e.g., substance abuse). The research will revolve around different topics such as: 1) the effects of exposure to violence in the media and in the community; 2) the effects of school-based interventions for reducing aggressive and disruptive behavior; and 3) the development of aggression in very high-risk populations such as psychiatric inpatients and juvenile delinquents. This is an excellent opportunity for all students but it might hold particular interest for students interested in psychology, social work, education, political science, and journalism.

9. NEW LIGHT RAIL CONNECTING PENN AND BROAD STREET STATIONS

Come July, commuting by train to Rutgers-Newark will get easier. On July 17, a light-rail service will begin operations, connecting Newark Penn Station with the Broad Street Station. Stops along the route will include the New Jersey Performing Arts Center, the Bears and Eagles Riverfront Stadium, and Washington Park. The light rail will provide fast, easy access to those locations, as well as to the Newark

Museum, the Newark Library, WBGO and the New Jersey Historic Society, and corporate offices on Broad and Washington streets. Fares are \$1.25 each way; passengers with monthly or weekly NJ Transit passes can transfer to the light rail at no extra charge.
