#### **5. WOMEN'S STUDIES PROGRAM GENDER AND GLOBALIZATION SERIES**

The Rutgers-Newark Women's Studies program continues its Gender and Globalization colloquium series with a lecture entitled, "UMOJA: How an African Village is Banning Violence against Women" delivered by Rebecca Lolosoli, a human rights activist from Kenya and founder of UMOJA, and Vivian Stromberg, the Executive Director of the international women's rights organization MADRE. Together, these women and their respective organizations have transformed the village of Samburu by organizing human rights training for local women on HIV/AIDS, forced female genital mutilation (FGM), combating domestic violence and child marriage. They have also created programs that promote women's economic self-sufficiency and provide access to education and healthcare for Samburu women and their families.
