1. ATTENTION FRESHMAN: REGISTRATION ISSUES

*Freshmen who have not attended Honors College advisement should contact Seth Mann immediately at smann@rutgers.edu to arrange for an advisement session. If you did not attend advisement then you will not be able to register for spring courses.

*All freshmen are blocked from registration until they physically take their signed advisement forms in-person to the Registrar's Office (Blumenthal Hall, 3rd Floor). If you wish to register for classes then you must do this before November 14th.

*Students with financial holds on their records will not be permitted to register for classes. Please visit the Business Office (Blumenthal Hall, 3rd Floor) to settle any outstanding debt to the university as soon as possible.

2. GENERAL SPRING REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

On-line course registration begins this Sunday! Please visit

http://registrar.rutgers.edu/NW/NCAS_UC_Instr.html for a full registration schedule. To access the on-line registration systems please visit <https://webreg.rutgers.edu/webreg/login>. Your RUID is the 9 digit number assigned to you when you entered the university (it appear on you ID card) and your Personal Access Code (PAC) is your 4-digit month and day of birth (for example, a December 1st birthday would be written 1201) unless of course you've changed it to some alternate number. Once you access the system you will enter in all the 5-digit index numbers that accompany each of your course selections and press "add/drop." At this point you will be prompted for any special permission numbers (SPNs) that you may have received for various courses including those offered through the Honors College. After entering these numbers you will press "add/drop" again.

3. SPECIAL ORGANIC CHEMISTRY REGISTRATION RESTRICTIONS

The Chemistry department has imposed the following restrictions on registration for the spring-term organic chemistry lab (160:331):

Sun, Nov 12 - registration is open ONLY to seniors

Mon, Nov 13 - registration is open ONLY to seniors and pharmacy 2+4 students

Tue, Nov 14 - (and all remaining days) – registration is open to all students.

4. WRITING INTENSIVE COURSES

As many of you know, all students planning on graduating from Rutgers-Newark are required to take two "writing intensive" courses. At least one of these courses has to be in your major. -Inside Washington Academic Seminar: The first week of this program is an ideal time (swearing in of 110th Congress) for students to think about attending this annual Washington Center program. Students will have the afternoon of the swearing-in time to visit Hill offices, introduce themselves and hopefully meet their representatives and be invited to some of the Hill receptions. The theme for the second week of the program is “Politics and Media” and is led by a former ABC news correspondent. Accepted students may choose either or both weeks. The early deadline (guaranteed space) is November 13, 2006 and the regular deadline for applications is Dec. 8, 2006.
